Du Bois, and Thorstein Veblen and the founders of American sociology (William Graham Sumner, Albion Small, Franklin Giddings, Lester Frank Ward, Edward A. Ross, Charles Horton Cooley, and Howard W. Odum). Also included is a complete collection of first editions from the University of Chicago Sociology Series, books from the University of North Carolina Press and a substantial amount of African-Americana.
