## **AUGUSTUS WELBY NORTHMORE PUGIN (1812-1852)**

Augustus Welby Northmore Pugin (1812-1852), English architect, designer and author, was a leading figure in the Gothic Revival and the Oxford Movements. His designs include St. Chad's Cathedral, Birmingham, Balliol College, Oxford, and St. Augustine's Church, Ramsgate. His *True Principles of Pointed or Christian Architecture* (1841) inspired John Ruskin. During his last years he worked with Sir Charles Barry on the new Palace of Westminster. Pugin died in London on September 14, 1852.

# **Scope and Contents**

The Osborn Collection of drawings by Augustus Welby Northmore Pugin (1812-1852) is listed according to the catalog numbers given in the *Catalogue of the Drawings Collection of the Royal Institute of British Architects: The Pugin Family,* by Alexandra Wedgwood. Brief descriptions are provided in this list: for full details, see the Wedgwood catalogue.

Many of the drawings have been rematted for exhibition use, as a result of which they are stored according to size. The list of drawings is arranged in Wedgwood number order, with the box location of each drawing indicated to the left of each entry.
