John C. Wilson (1899-1961)

Born in Trenton, New Jersey and educated at Phillips Academy and Yale University, John C. Wilson (1899-1961) worked briefly for C. D. Barney & Co. on Wall Street before becoming a producer and director. From the early 1930s to mid 1950s, Wilson served as Noel Coward's personal manager and, in 1934, with Coward, Lynn Fontanne, and Alfred Lunt, he established Transatlantic Productions, with exclusive production rights to Coward's plays in the United States. Wilson also served as co-director of the Westport Country Playhouse from the early 1940s to mid 1950s.

Description of the Papers

In Series I, sixty-one scrapbooks containing clippings, printed ephemera, and photographs document Wilson's life, activities, and interests. Clippings relate to Wilson's stage productions, stage and film actors, theater, and other topics. Photographic materials in Series II include photograph albums, studio and artists' portraits of Wilson, snapshots of Wilson and others, and publicity photographs of stage productions. There are photographs of Wilson, family members, friends, and stage colleagues, including: Wilson's wife, Natalie Paley, Leonora Corbett, Noel Coward, Martin Manulis, Armina Marshall, Mildred Natwick, Graham Payn, and Clifton Webb, among others. Other papers include correspondence, printed material, such as playbills, writings, and other material.

Arrangement

Organized into three series: Series I. Scrapbooks, 1919-1961. II. Photographs, 1900-1969. III. Other Papers, 1898-1978.

Collection Contents

Series I: Scrapbooks, 1919–1961

Series I. consists of 61 scrapbooks containing material relating to Wilson's life, activities, and interests. Scrapbooks contain clippings chiefly, dating from 1919 through 1961, but printed ephemera and photographs can also be found. Clippings relate to Wilson's stage productions, stage and film actors, and other topics.

Clippings chiefly in English, with some material in French.

Series II: Photographs, 1900–1969*3.93 linear feet (4 boxes) + broadside*

Series II. Photographs contains photograph albums, studio and artists' portraits of Wilson, snapshots of Wilson and others, and approximately 50 publicity photographs of stage productions of Wilson's "Broadway Shows." Albums document Wilson's childhood and trips to Europe in the 1920s and 1930s. Snapshots include Wilson's family, friends, and stage colleagues: Wilson's wife, Natalie Paley, Leonora Corbett, Noel Coward, Martin Manulis, Armina Marshall, Mildred Natwick, Graham Payn, and Clifton Webb, among others. The publicity photographs identify actors and productions.

Series III: Other Papers, 1898–1978*3.67 linear feet (8 boxes)*

Series III. Other Papers includes correspondence, printed material, writings, and other material. Correspondents includes Noel Coward and Wilson's niece, Barbara (Cart) Macauley, and sister, Dorothy Wilson. The printed materials feature approximately 100 playbills for stage productions relating to Wilson and Coward. Writings include drafts of biographical and autobiographical works, "Actors Aren't People" and "Stagestruck" respectively. Other personal and juvenile items, such as a baby book, coloring book, and locks of Wilson's hair, can also be found.
