D. Michael Cheers

D. Michael Cheers is a photojournalist, writer, documentary filmmaker and educator. He received a B.A. and M.S. in Journalism, and an M.A. in African Studies from Boston University. He received his Ph.D. in African Studies and Research from Howard University. Cheers was a co-editor of *Songs of My People*, a book and touring exhibition that featured the work of fifty African American photographers. From 1995 to 2000, Cheers was the managing editor of *Ebony South Africa* magazine, which was developed for the citizens of post-apartheid South Africa. Since 2006, Cheers has been an Associate Professor of Photojournalism in the School of Journalism and Mass Communications at San Jose State University.

Scope and Contents

This collection contains photographic prints, slides and negatives by photojournalist D. Michael Cheers. The bulk of the photographs contain images used for articles in *Ebony South Africa*, of which Cheers was managing editor from 1995-2000. Other material includes Cheers' photojournalism work, including his coverage of Jesse Jackson's presidential campaigns, the Rainbow Coalition, Jackson's meetings with Nelson Mandela, and photographs of Hugh Masekela.

The South African edition of *Ebony* magazine was published between 1995-2000. D. Michael Cheers was the managing editor of the magazine for the duration of its publication. Material in this series includes negatives, transparencies, photographic prints, articles, and other material related to *Ebony South Africa*. Subjects documented include South African writers, artists, musicians, and politicians, including Nelson Mandela and Hugh Masekela. The series also includes the magazine's business records such as correspondence, memos, story ideas, and article drafts.

Photographic film in this series include negatives as well as transparencies.

Material is primarily arranged by project or magazine article. Business records are arranged at the end of the series.
