Papers written by Lord Dartmouth during his confinement in the Tower of London, ending with his death on October 25, 1691. The 26 pages include the warrant for his arrest, "you are to apprehend [Dartmouth] and seize for High Treason" and the events that follow. Dartmouth professes his innocence, but promises to arrive in London the next morning, keeping the arrest a secret from his family by pretending to have urgent business in London "as indeed it was." Upon arrival, he is summoned by Lord Nottingham and others to stand trial. A series of questions, along with Dartmouth's pleas of loyalty to England, follow. "My Lords I am a plaine man, and I desire to answer plainly; I positively protest I have received nothing from [King James] directly or indirectly" (p.725).

After the trial, Dartmouth is put in custody of the Sergeant at Arms, although he protests that "I had rather stay, tho I were sure to dye in England, than go to live in France" (p.733). In the end, Dartmouth fails to prove his innocence, and is sent to the Tower (p.739). His last letter, written to Lord Sydney [Henry Sidney, earl of Romney (1641-1704)] states that "to find myself thus stigmatized as a Traytor to my Country, and that in the behalfe of France, is the greiviousest burthen can possibly be lay'd upon me."
