Custodial History

The material in the collection was formerly owned by the Stoke Newington Public Library in London, and all items have the library's ownership stamp.

In 1905 the library was the beneficiary of a substantial bequest from the antiquarian collector and historian Edward J. Sage, one of the founding library commissioners for Stoke Newington. His bequest included more than five thousand books and a large collection of prints, manuscripts, and ephemera. While it is not certain, it is likely that much of the material described in this finding aid was part of that bequest as other Walpole-related items in the Sage bequest were purchased at auction, and from dealers, by Wilmarth Lewis during his lifetime, and by the Lewis Walpole Library afterward. This material can be identified by searching "Stoke Newington Public Library" in the Yale University Library catalog.

Stoke Newington Public Library

The Stoke Newington Public Library was founded in the early 1890s, in a building constructed with funding from the philanthropist John Passmore Edwards. It is located in the Borough of Hackney, in northeast London.

Scope and Contents

A collection of printed portraits, topographical views, real estate advertisements, maps, and other ephemera associated with the English historian and collector Horace Walpole (1717-1797), his family, and their properties. The majority of the items are plates produced for publications, and over half of the collection is related to two of the family's estates, Strawberry Hill in Twickenham, Middlesex, and Houghton Hall near King's Lynn, Norfolk.

Series I holds engraved portraits of Walpole, his father Robert Walpole, other Walpole and Waldegrave family members, and friends such as Mary Berry and Anne Seymour Damer. Series II documents the sale and development of Strawberry Hill and Houghton Hall through printed prospectuses with hand-colored maps and site plans issued by London firms marketing the properties. Also present are engraved views of the houses, a photograph of Houghton Hall taken from *Norfolk Photographically Illustrated* (1865), prints of Strawberry Hill interiors, and views of homes of Walpole's associates. Series III contains a disparate group of Walpole-related items, including a receipt signed by Horatio Walpole of Wolterton (1716), a manuscript note from Horace Walpole to Joseph Cooper Walker (1792), and a prospectus for Mrs. Paget Toynbee's edition of *The Letters of Horace Walpole* (1903), among other papers, prints, and photographs.

Arrangement

Organized into three series: I. People (1746-1884), II. Places (1773-1901), and III. Other Papers (1716-1903).

Collection Contents

Series I: People, 1746-1884

30 Folders

Series I holds printed portraits of Walpole and Waldegrave family members primarily created as plates for eighteenth and nineteenth-century publications. Multiple portraits are present for Horace Walpole (1717-1797) and his father Robert Walpole, Earl of Orford (1676-1745), as well as other key associates such as his publisher Richard Bentley and friends Mary Berry, William Cole, and Anne Seymour Damer. The collection also contains a few early twentieth-century photographs of portraits, both printed and painted.

Series II: Places, 1773-1901

30 Folders

Series II primarily documents the sale and development, in the late nineteenth century, of Strawberry Hill, Horace Walpole's estate in Twickenham, and Houghton Hall, the family's estate in Norfolk, through printed auction prospectuses, maps, and site plans issued by London firms marketing the properties. Material is present too for Little Strawberry Hill, which was at times offered separately from Strawberry Hill, as well as the family's home at 15 Berkeley Square, London. Also here are engraved views and floor plans of Strawberry Hill and Houghton Hall removed from publications, a photograph of Houghton Hall (1865, a plate from *Norfolk Photographically Illustrated*), prints of Strawberry Hill interiors, chimneys, and collection objects (plates engraved for *A Description of the Villa of Mr. Horace Walpole*), and newspaper clippings describing the estates. In addition, there are views of homes of the Berry, Chute, and Townsend families, and another Walpole ancestral home, Wolterton Hall in Norfolk.

Series III: Other Papers, 1716–1903

8 Folders

Series III contains a disparate group of Walpole-related texts and visual materials ranging from a 1716 receipt for tonnage signed by Horatio Walpole of Wolterton to a 1903 prospectus for Mrs. Paget Toynbee's edition of *The Letters of Horace Walpole*. There is a print view of "The Castle of Otranto," one of the monument to King Theodore erected by Horace Walpole at St. Ann Westminster, and text pages removed from different editions of *The Letters of Horace Walpole*. Also in the series is a 1792 manuscript note sent from Horace Walpole to Joseph Cooper Walker; its content was published in volume 42, page 384 of *The Yale Edition of Horace Walpole's Correspondence* (New Haven: 1980) based on an 1885 edition of his letters, but the manuscript itself had been untraced since 1905.
