Multiple photographs document Joseph Lee, Nancy Lee, and Karl Kim's involvement with the Young Korean Academy Congress and the Korean Independence Movement. Five photographs are panoramas (four of which depict members of the Young Korean Academy). Included are two school books (*English Lessons* and *English for New Americans*) belonging to Nancy Kim, the 1942 annual for Berendo Junior High School in Los Angeles, and a 1908 copy of *Primer of Facts About Music*. Biographical / Historical

Joseph W. Lee (1894-1987) and Nancy L. Kim Lee (1900-1978) immigrated to the United States from Korea in 1906 and 1916, respectively. They were married in 1918 in Manteca, California, and had three children: Ruth Lee, Richard Lee, and Irene Lee. The family lived both in Manteca and in San Dimas prior to moving to Los Angeles. Nancy Lee's brother, Karl T. Kim (1895-), lived with the family for a period of time. Both Joseph Lee and Nancy Lee died in Alameda, California.
