**SUMMARY:** Michael L. Charney (1946 - ) is a psychiatrist and life-long public health and social rights activist. The collection documents Charney's student activism while attending the Yale School of Medicine from 1968-1972. Materials document his involvement with student protests at Yale and the Yale School of Medicine; work as editor of the Yale Medical Center Newsletter; involvement with student strikes and the creation of The Organizer's Manual; participation in health activism and social justice groups including the Medical Committee for Human Rights, Nader's Raiders Occupational Health and Safety Project, and Student Health Organizations; support of Vietnam War protests and his application for conscientious objector status to the draft; and involvement with community activists and protests in New Haven, including the Black Panther Party May Day protest. The collection also includes materials documenting Charney witnessing and reporting arson of a student protest structure on the Beinecke plaza in 1988. Materials include correspondence, ephemera, magazine articles and newspaper clippings, newsletters, notebooks, organizational records, pamphlets, posters, and publications.

## Biographical / Historical

Michael L. Charney (1946 - ) is a psychiatrist and psychoanalyst with a life-long commitment to activism. Charney graduated from Yale College in 1968, then attended Yale School of Medicine, completing an MD with a specialization in psychiatry in 1972. He completed an internship at Cambridge Hospital, residency at Harvard Medical School's Brigham and Women's Hospital, and a fellowship in child and adolescent psychiatry at Massachusetts General Hospital before opening a private practice in 1978.

During his time at Yale Charney was involved in activism and protests related to medical care, public health, occupational safety, the Vietnam War, racism and community planning, politics, governance of universities, and efforts to establish non-smoking areas at Yale. His activism continued after completing his MD and has included initiatives to reduce the proliferation of nuclear weapons, enact seatbelt laws, and advocate for environmental protection.

## Content Description

The collection documents Michael L. Charney's student activism while attending the Yale School of Medicine from 1968-1972. The collection also includes materials documenting Charney witnessing and reporting arson of a student protest structure on the Beinecke plaza in 1988. Materials include newsletters, pamphlets, newspaper clippings, documents, correspondence, ephemera, and posters.

Series I. Medical activism, 1967-2000, includes materials from Charney's participation in multiple groups focused on providing more equitable access to health care and improving public health. The sections on the Medical Committee for Human Rights (MCHR) and the Student Health Organization (SHO) include internal documents from chapters of the organizations and group publications. Nader's Raider's materials document Charney's work on the group's Occupational Safety and Health project. He conducted research

used to help draft the *Health bill of rights for workers* that led to the passage of the Occupational Safety and Health Act (OSHA) in 1970. There are also materials from group reunions in 1989 and 2000. The largest amount of material in Series I. is related to the *Yale Medical Center Newsletter*, a student activism publication co-founded and co-edited by Charney and his Yale School of Medicine classmate Barry Rand. Beth Lorenzo, a secretary at the Yale School of Public Health, assisted with management and production of the newsletter, including typing and xeroxing the first 9 issues, and typing and prepping for offset printing later issues. Students from the SHO assisted with distribution. Newsletter materials include planning documents, fact sheets, some pasteup materials, and copies of issues from Volumes I. and II.

Series II. New Haven community activism, 1968–1972, includes publications, posters, and clippings related to Charney's involvement with the New Haven chapter of the Black Panther Party and the May Day protests of 1970 and a small amount of material from the New Haven Citizen's Action Project, New Haven Committee for a Sane Nuclear Policy (SANE), and clippings about the Oak Street project in New Haven, a highway initiative that required the destruction of a poor neighborhood in the downtown area.

Series III. *Organizer's Manual*, 1970-1971, includes materials related to Charney's activities organizing a multi-university ad hoc student strike collective after the National Guard shooting of students protesting at Kent State University. The collective, which met in college campus dorms, produced the *Organizer's Manual*, a guide for anyone involved in movements for social change. Materials in this series include planning notebooks, style guides, contracts, correspondence, advertising, reviews, and two copies of the publication.

Series IV. Political parties and elections, 1968–1969, includes materials documenting Charney's involvement with the 1968 Eugene McCarthy Democratic presidential campaign, the New Party, and Students for a Democratic Society (SDS). The series includes campaign materials and SDS internal documents and publications.

Series V. Vietnam War, 1965–1973, includes materials related to Charney's attempt to apply for conscientious objector status with the U.S. Armed Services; material related to anti-war protests at Yale University, including materials created by the Yale Asia Information Project and the New Haven Draft Information Center; and a variety of printed materials related to protests against United States involvement in the Vietnam War, including Vietnam Summer, the Vietnam Moratorium Committee, and publications on conscientious objection.

Series VI. Yale, 1968-1988, includes materials documenting Charney's time as a student at the Yale School of Medicine (YSM), activism and protest at Yale University and YSM, coeducation at Yale, and student governance. The series also includes materials related to Charney witnessing and reporting arson of an anti-apartheid student protest structure on the Beinecke plaza in 1988.

Series VII. Leftist literature, 1966–1973, includes a variety of printed materials collected by Charney. Materials include magazine articles, fliers, newsletters, newspapers, and pamphlets created by organizations promoting social change such as women's liberation, labor movements, and racial equality in the United States. Publishing organizations include the American Civil Liberties Union (ACLU), American Jewish Committee, Catholic Worker, Liberated Guardian Workers Collective, National High School Strike Committee, and the Young Socialist Alliance.

Series VIII. Articles about the 1960s, social movements, and protests, 1966–1971, includes newspaper and magazine articles from the 1960s on a variety of current topics and retrospective articles published in 1969-1970 analyzing the social movements and political unrest of the 1960s era.
