## Susannah Hays (born 1959)

Susannah Hays is an experimental photographer, book artist, and educator. She is known for using cameraless and historical photographic processes in her experimentation in visual media.

Hays was born in Boston, Massachusetts, and earned a Bachelor of Arts from Mills College in 1982 and a Master of Fine Arts in photography from the San Francisco Art Institute in 1991 as well as a Master of Arts in Visual Studies in 2002 and doctoral degree in Interdisciplinary Studies in 2016 from the University of California, Berkeley.

From 1990 to 2012 Hays was the sole proprietor of Works on Paper, a paper conservation laboratory specializing in the preservation of photographs and the production of Artist's books. She was also a faculty member of the San Francisco Art Institute from 2001 to 2012.

From 1991 to 1997 she was married to artist Matt Phillips. She lives in Santa Fe, New Mexico.

## **Scope and Contents**

Collection that includes a complete set of the "Empty Bottle Photograms" series of photographs created Susannah Hays, 1998-2000, that comprise fifteen photograms of empty bottles placed on photographic paper as well as a photogram of a leaf that marks a shift in her practice to photograms of plant leaves. Material in the collection related to the series includes copy photographs of the images as color

transparencies and digital surrogates as well as documentation of associated exhibitions, reviews, and publications.

### Empty Bottle Photograms, 1998-2000

Complete set of the *Empty Bottle Photograms* series of photographs created Susannah Hays in 1998-2000 that comprise fifteen photograms of empty bottles placed on photographic paper as well as a photogram *Seed Leaf* (2000), which Hays included with the series to represent her transition to photograms of plant leaves. Most prints are signed, dated, numbered, and titled on verso in graphite except where noted in this guide. Inscriptions on some prints indicate editions of 5, 6, 10, and 25; print with smaller edition numbers reflect decisions by Hays to not print these images in larger editions.
