Processing Information

Collections are processed to a variety of levels, depending on the work necessary to make them usable, their perceived research value, the availability of staff, competing priorities, and whether or not further accruals are expected. The library attempts to provide a basic level of preservation and access for all collections [as they are acquired], and does more extensive processing of higher priority collections as time and resources permit.

This collection received a basic level of processing, including rehousing and minimal organization.

Folder titles appearing in the contents list below are often based on those provided by the creator or previous custodian. Titles have not been verified against the contents of the folders in all cases. Otherwise, folder titles are supplied by staff during initial processing.

This finding aid may be updated periodically to account for new acquisitions to the collection and/or revisions in arrangement and description.

Robin W. Winks (1930-2003)

Robin William Evert Winks was born in Indiana on December 5, 1930. He graduated from the University of Colorado in 1952 and received an M.A. in Maori studies from Victoria University as a Fulbright Scholar in New Zealand. He received his Ph.D. from Johns Hopkins in 1957. Winks joined Yale's history department in 1957, serving as its chairman from 1996 to 1999. From 1999 to 2000, he was the Vyvyan Harmsworth visiting professor of American history at Oxford University. He was a prolific author and in 1987 published *Cloak & Gown: Scholars in America's Secret War*, an account of the Central Intelligence Agency's relationship with major American universities. Winks died in New Haven, Connecticut, on April 7, 2003.

Scope and Contents

The collection consists of writings, printed material, and videocassettes relating to United States intelligence services and officers, including the Office of Strategic Services (OSS), the Central Intelligence Agency (CIA), and the Association of Former Intelligence Officers. Writings contain drafts of books, articles, and television show proposals by authors including Christopher M. Andrew, William E. Duff, Anthony Ross Potter, Russell Jack Smith, Bayard Stockton, Douglas L. Wheeler, and Robin W. Winks. Also included are newsletters, invitations, conference programs, and other papers from the Veterans Association of O.S.S., the Association of Former Intelligence Officers, and other organizations; booklets, articles, book reviews, and other papers relating to the CIA and OSS; and photographs used in the

production of Winks's book *Cloak & Gown*. The collection also contains correspondence relating to Yale University Library's acquisition of articles from the CIA's journal *Studies in Intelligence*, along with photocopies of selected articles from the journal.
