SUMMARY: Photograph albums and photographic postcards created, collected, and compiled by Alvina Sophia Alm Welsh that document the social and cultural life of the Alm and Welsh families, including their network of friends and acquaintances chiefly in Minnesota, Montana, North Dakota, and Wisconsin, approximately 1908-1930, with the bulk of material approximately 1913-1920. The collection includes more than 240 photographic postcards, a photograph album with 127 photographs, and 41 photographic prints from a photograph album dismantled before its acquisition by the library.

Processing Information

Collections are processed to a variety of levels, depending on the work necessary to make them usable, their perceived research value, the availability of staff, competing priorities, and whether or not further accruals are expected. The library attempts to provide a basic level of preservation and access for all collections, and does more extensive processing of higher priority collections as time and resources permit. This guide derives from a detailed examination of each print. This includes an initial arrangement by Ashley Cale as well as a review by Matthew Daniel Mason, who also drafted the front matter to this guide.

Alvina Sophia Alm Welsh (1893-1974)

Alvina Sophia Alm Welsh was a schoolteacher in eastern Montana. She was born in Alden, Wisconsin, to Edward Christensen Alm (1857-1919) and Anna Larsdatter Gilbertson Alm (1862-1935). Her father was a second-generation Norwegian American, and her mother immigrated from Norway as a child. Her siblings include an older brother Levi Carl Alm (1891-1966) and younger siblings Maurice Sigfred Alm (1896-1984) and Gena Alm Larson (1897-1977).

Welsh attended a school in Amery, Wisconsin and in 1912 completed a summer session course related to teacher training at the Superior Normal School, Superior, Wisconsin. By 1913, she was teaching at Yates, Montana, and later at nearby Fallon.

In June 1918, she ceased teaching and married farmer Raleigh Harrison Welsh (1889-1970), son of Albert Welsh (1846-1934) and Zeete Angelina Mowry Welsh (1849-1903), who established a homestead in Wibaux County, Montana. He was one of seven siblings that survived infancy. They engaged in farming at the Welsh family homestead in Wibaux County and had a son, Duane Curtis Welsh (1924-2019). Around 1944-1946, the couple retired and settled in Wibaux. Both died in hospitals in Beach, North Dakota.

Scope and Contents

Photograph albums and photographic postcards created, collected, and compiled by Alvina Sophia Alm Welsh that document the social and cultural life of the Alm and Welsh families as well as their network of friends and acquaintances chiefly in Minnesota, Montana, North Dakota, and Wisconsin, approximately 1908-1930. The collection includes more than 240 photographic postcards as well as a photograph album with 127 photographs and 41 photographic prints from a photograph album dismantled before its acquisition by the library.

Images in the albums and photographic postcards document informal interior and exterior portraits as well as commercial studio portraits of Welsh and others, including examples of persons wearing traditional Norwegian dress and crossdressing, as well as photographs related to logging, farming, and ranching activities including several views with agricultural machinery planting and harvesting crops. Social and recreational activities include excursions, picnics, and family gatherings. The collection also includes a group portrait of Native American children, women, and men, likely Ojibwe or Menominee, probably at a logging or maple-sugaring camp.

Arrangement

Organized into two series: I. Photograph Albums, approximately 1913-1920. II. Photographic Postcards, approximately 1908-1930.

Collection Contents

Series I: Photograph Albums, approximately 1913-1920

Series I consists of photograph albums compiled by Alvina S. Alm Welsh, approximately 1913-1920, including an extant album and photographic prints from a dismantled album.

Series I is organized into two subseries: Album and Photographic Prints from a Dismantled Album.

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Photograph album compiled by Alvina S. Alm Welsh, approximately 1913-1920, with 127 photographic prints, 15.3 x 20.4 cm and smaller, that documents the social and cultural life of the Alm and Welsh families in Minnesota, Montana, North Dakota, and Wisconsin. Images document recreational activities, logging, farming, and ranching activities (including several views with agricultural machinery), local excursions, domestic work, hunting and fishing expeditions, schoolhouses, and automobiles.

Manuscript notations by an unidentified person identify individuals and locations as well as provide captions for many images, although some inscriptions and photographs exhibit fading or have become illegible. Several prints are damaged or dismantled from album leaves. Several images represented in the album also appear in the photographic postcards in the collection.

Many photographs document farms and ranches related to the Alm and Welsh families and their friends. Sites identified in Montana include the "Medicine Rocks," a series of sandstone pillars near Ekalaka (later encompassed by Medicine Rocks State Park, established in 1957) that also include persons gathering creeping cedar (*Juniperus horizontalis*) as well as views of the BN Ranch at Ash Creek and the Sievert Ranch at Nye and discrete views of Terry and Yates. Sites identified in Wisconsin include views of rivers and lakes, including the St. Croix River at Hudson, as well as views of Deronda and Milltown. There are also views of Stillwater in Minnesota and Casselton in North Dakota.

Individuals identified in the album include a toddler Stanley Lamont and members of the Gilbert and Wickersham families as well as many others identified by their forenames including Alice, Cora, Edna, Floyd, Gena, Irving, Ivan, Levi, Louise, Mabel, Maurice, Mike, and Olaf.

Photographic Prints from a Dismantled Album

Photographic prints from a photograph album compiled by Alvina Sophia Alm Welsh, approximately 1913-1920, and dismantled before acquisition by the library, which document the social and cultural life of Welsh and her friends. This material consists of forty-one photographic prints with many images duplicating prints in the extant album in the collection.

Images include interior, exterior, and studio portraits of Welsh and others, with many photographs related to a group identified as the Sucker Branch Choir as well as documentation of recreational activities including wading in a lake. A group of photographs documents a crew of the Northern Pacific Railway Company repairing railway tracks with a work train attached to a Baldwin E-2 locomotive (Number 383).

Series II: Photographic Postcards, approximately 1908–1930

Series II consists of 243 photographic postcards created and collected by Alvina Sophia Alm Welsh, approximately 1900-1930, that document the cultural and social life of the Alm and Welsh families as well as their network of family, friends, and acquaintances. Many postcards include correspondence and manuscript notations on rectos and versos. Some images documented in the photographic postcards also appear in the complete photograph album in the collection. There are also two printed picture postcards related to Superior, Wisconsin.

Photographs of social activities include weddings, picnics, family gatherings, and school sports teams.

Images of agricultural activities include planting and harvesting crops, building barns, and herding cattle for the market. The collection includes a group portrait of Native American children, women, and men, likely Ojibwe or Menominee persons, probably at a logging or maple sugaring camp.

Informal interior and exterior portraits as well as commercial studio portraits document Welsh and others, which also includes examples of individuals wearing traditional Norwegian dress and crossdressing.

Series II is organized into three subseries: Portraits of Alvina Sophia Alm Welsh, Portraits of Others, and Places.
