Processing Information

Collections are processed to a variety of levels, depending on the work necessary to make them usable, their perceived research value, the availability of staff, competing priorities, and whether or not further accruals are expected. The library attempts to provide a basic level of preservation and access for all collections, and does more extensive processing of higher priority collections as time and resources permit.

Information included in the Description of Papers note and Collection Contents section is drawn from information supplied with the collection and from an initial survey of the contents. Most folder titles appearing in the contents list below were transcribed from the recto or verso of the artwork. Otherwise, folder titles were supplied by staff during processing.

This finding aid may be updated periodically to account for new acquisitions to the collection and/or revisions in arrangement and description.

Alexis de Tocqueville (1805-1859)

Alexis de Tocqueville was a French politician and author best known for *De la Démocratie en Amérique* (1835, 1840). He traveled to the United States with his friend Gustave de Beaumont in 1831 after receiving a commission from King Louis-Phillipe to study the American penitentiary system. After nine months, they returned to France and published *Du Système Pénitentiare aux Etats-Unis, et de son Application en France* (two volumes, 1833). Tocqueville married Mary Mottley (1799-1864) in 1835.

Hervé de Tocqueville (1772-1856)

Hervé Clérel de Tocqueville was a French politician and the father of Alexis de Tocqueville. He served as prefect for the departments of Maine-et-Loire (1814-1815), Oise (1815-1816), Côte-d'Or (1816-1817), Moselle (1817-1824), the Somme (1823-1826), and Seine-et-Oise (1826-1828). He was also the author of *Coup d'œil sur le règne de Louis XVI*, first published in 1850.

Scope and Contents

The collection consists of correspondence, writings, notes, ledgers, government documents, and other papers relating to Alexis de Tocqueville, his friend and collaborator Gustave de Beaumont, and his father Hervé Clérel de Tocqueville. Correspondence includes a draft letter from Alexis de Tocqueville to John Stuart Mill, and letters to Tocqueville from Louis de Loménie, Richard Monckton Milnes, and Nassau William Senior. Also present are materials concerning the Tocqueville chateau and estate, including correspondence of Alexis de Tocqueville with lawyers and tradespeople, notes, and drawings of fences and gates. Writings contain an autograph manuscript copy of several volumes from Beaumont's edition of *Œuvres complètes d'Alexis de Tocqueville* (9 volumes, 1864-1867), including Tocqueville's works on travels in the United States, England, and Ireland; Beaumont's notes on reviews of *De la Démocratie en Amérique*

in the French and foreign press; and Mary Mottley Tocqueville's notes on a manuscript relating to Thomas Robert Bugeaud. Papers of Hervé Clérel de Tocqueville consist of volumes of reports, speeches, bills, and other papers relating to his work as a prefect and member of the Chambre des Pairs, and drafts of writings such as *Coup d'œil sur le règne de Louis XVI* and "Des causes de la révolution du 20 mars et du retour de Bonaparte." The collection further contains 20th century materials concerning publication of Tocqueville's works by editor J. P. Mayer and photographs of the Tocqueville family estate.

Series I: Alexis de Tocqueville Papers, 1835-1864, undated

This series contains papers and correspondence of Alexis de Tocqueville and his writing partner Gustave de Beaumont. Included are letters to Tocqueville from Louis de Loménie, Richard Monckton Milnes, and Nassau William Senior, and a draft letter from Tocqueville to John Stuart Mill. The series contains autograph manuscript drafts from several volumes of *Œuvres complètes d'Alexis de Tocqueville*, Beaumont's edition of posthumously published Tocqueville works, as well as his collection of reviews of *Democracy in America*. Also included are a small amount of notes by Mary Mottley, Tocqueville's wife, and correspondence, notes, drawings, and other papers concerning the Tocqueville family chateau and estate.

This series consists of correspondence, agreements, notes, and other materials concerning Jacob-Peter Mayer's publication of Tocqueville's *Oeuvres Complètes* (27 volumes, 1951-1983), printed material, and photographs of the Tocqueville family chateau. Correspondents include Count Jean de Tocqueville. The series additionally contains an 18th century document that may relate to the family or its property.
