The collection includes seven scripts; most notable is the revised final screenplay for *Imitation of Life*. Moore played Annie Johnson in her Academy Award-nominated role in the 1959 film. Other highlights include documents related to the Cambridge Players, a black theater troupe founded, in part, by Moore. Close to 600 photographs capture Moore's life both personally and professionally. Prints include performances and promotions as well as images of Moore in her 20s and 30s alongside family and friends. The collection also includes several awards, one of them from the Black Filmmakers Hall of Fame.

## Processing Information

## Biographical / Historical

Juanita Moore (1914-2014) was born in Greenwood, Mississippi and spent a majority of her life as a dancer, actress, and stage performer. She appeared in more than 70 movies and numerous plays during her 60-year career which began at the age of 17 as a dancer. Moore is best known for her role as Annie Johnson, an African-American housekeeper in the 1959 film *Imitation of Life*. It earned her an Academy Award nomination, only the third black actress to be nominated for the Supporting Actress category at the time. Moore turned to activism and refused to play maids or similar roles following her nomination. She appeared in several TV shows in the 1960s and pursued theater work in addition to her work on the screen. In the 1980s, Moore was a founding member of the Cambridge Players, a black theater troupe. Moore worked well into the early 2000s. She died at her Los Angeles home at the age of 99.
