Processing Information

This collection serves as a means for bringing together photographic materials acquired singularly and in small groups. Occasionally, a critical mass of photographs by a particular photographer or studio accrues within the collection and becomes the basis for a separate collection documenting that individual or studio.

Scope and Contents

Photographs of Asian Americans created by Asian American photographers and others, chiefly in California, circa 1930-1982.

Portraiture in the collection includes wedding portraits and graduation portraits, as well as studio portraits of families and individuals. Identified sites of images include a group in front of the Soto Zen Mission of the Sokoji Buddhist Church in San Francisco, California, and a group portrait of attendees of the Western Federation of Buddhist Sunday School Teachers League Conference in front of the Lodi Buddhist Church in Lodi, California, in January 1957.

Photographers represented in the collection include Eschol Manning Hammond, Paul Henry Hammond, Miyowa (George) Hishida, Sadaichi Imada, Morinosuke (Jack) Kamikihara, Charles Fred Kohler, and Richard S. Yoshikawa.

Photographic studios represented in the collection include Barboni Studio, George Studio, Hammond Studio, Imada Studio, Kami Studio, Salon Studio, Sandino Studio, Tru-Lite Studio, Wee Picture Studio, and Yoshikawa Studio.

Image descriptions of the photographic prints are derived from inscriptions on the verso and recto of the item and from image analysis by the archivist. Descriptions usually include information about the working locations of the photographer or studio, and occasionally physical characteristics of items, such as image numbers applied by the photographers or inscriptions by previous owners, as well as contextual information about the images.

Each folder contains a single photographic print.

Arrangement

Organized into two series: I. Photographs, circa 1930-circa 1965. II. Oversize Photographs, circa 1930-1982.

Collection Contents

Series I: Photographs, circa 1930-circa 1965
