**SUMMARY:** The Beinecke Library construction photographs consist of mostly black and white, with some color, photographic prints documenting the construction of the Beinecke Rare Book and Manuscript Library between 1960 and 1963. The photographs capture exterior and interior shots of the construction process, as well as images of the finished building, the movement of collections from Sterling Memorial Library, the opening reception, and notable contributors to the creation of the library including University Librarian James Babb, inaugural Beinecke Library Director Herman W. "Fritz" Liebert, Edwin Beinecke, Frederick Beinecke, and sculptor Isamu Noguchi. The photographer is unknown for most prints - a small group of photographs were taken by C. T. Alburtus.

### Processing Information

The Beinecke Library construction photographs were initially described by Kathi Isham as part of the Beinecke Rare Book and Manuscript Records (BRBL RECORD GROUP 1). In 2025 Michael Rush separated the construction photographs from the Beinecke Rare Book and Manuscript Records to facilitate continued public access to the photographs. At that time he made adjustments to the arrangement and description.

Collections are processed to a variety of levels, depending on the work necessary to make them usable, their perceived research value, the availability of staff, competing priorities, and whether or not further accruals are expected. The library attempts to provide a basic level of preservation and access for all collections, and does more extensive processing of higher priority collections as time and resources permit.

This finding aid may be updated periodically to account for new acquisitions to the collection or revisions in arrangement and description.

### Biographical / Historical

Yale University built the Beinecke Rare Book and Manuscript Library between 1960 and 1963. Architect Gordon Bunshaft of the firm Skidmore, Owings & Merrill designed the building. The George A. Fuller Construction Company was the general contractor. The building and its endowment are the gift of Edwin J. Beinecke, Yale 1907; Frederick W. Beinecke, Yale 1909; Walter Beinecke, Yale 1910; and their families.
