SUMMARY: Collection contains correspondence, writings, and other papers documenting the life and professional activities of author Ethan Mordden from the late 1960s to 1991. Correspondence, dating from the mid 1980s and early 1990s, contains letters from writers, actors, musicians and composers, publishers, and others, including Walta Borawski, Frank Ferko, Philip Gambone, Boze Hadleigh, Ron Hussman, Joey Manley, Kit Reed, and St. Martin's Press. Writings in the collection consist of notes and drafts for two novels, a book of film criticism entitled *Medium Cool: The Movies of the 1960s* (1990), and shorter works, including plays, stories, and essays. The novels "Welcome Home, Adam" (1970) and "The Friends of Lady Butch" (circa 1973-1975) are identified as Mordden's unpublished first novel and an unfinished Hollywood novel respectively. Other papers include a small amount of printed and Yale University course material.

Processing Information

In 2012 this collection received a basic level of processing, including rehousing and in some instances minimal organization.

The finding aid for this collection is largely compiled from a preliminary list created at or around the time of receipt by the library. The preliminary list was migrated to comply with current archival descriptive standards in 2007-2008. As part of the migration, modifications were made to the formatting of the list; however, the content of the list was neither modified nor verified.

As a rule, descriptive information found in the Collection Contents section is drawn in large part from information supplied with the collection and from an initial survey of the contents. Folder titles appearing in the contents list below are often based on those provided by the creator or previous custodian. Titles have not been verified against the contents of the folders in all cases. Otherwise, folder titles are supplied by staff during initial processing.

Ethan Mordden (1947-)

Ethan Mordden, born January 27, 1947, is an American cultural critic and novelist. He was educated in Quaker schools, including the Friends Academy in Locust Valley, New York, and at the University of Pennsylvania (1969). He worked as a musical director and coach in New York (1971-1974), as an assistant editor of *Opera News* (1974-1976), and a visiting fellow at Yale University (1980). He has been a regular contributor to *The New Yorker*, the *New York Times*, and *Christopher Street*, among other publications. In addition to books on music, theater, and film, he publishes fiction on gay life, especially in the "Buddies"

cycle, including *I've a Feeling We're Not in Kansas Anymore: Tales from Gay Manhattan* (1985), *Buddies* (1986), and *Everybody Loves You: Further Adventures in Gay Manhattan* (1988).
