This collection gathers together material relating to Norman Macleod, acquired from sources other than Macleod. Material acquired directly from Norman Macleod comprises the Norman Macleod Papers (YCAL MSS 718).

Collections are processed to a variety of levels, depending on the work necessary to make them usable, their perceived research value, the availability of staff, competing priorities, and whether or not further accruals are expected. The library attempts to provide a basic level of preservation and access for all collections, and does more extensive processing of higher priority collections as time and resources permit.

This collection received a basic level of processing, including rehousing and organization by acquisition. Various acquisitions associated with the collection have not been merged and organized as a whole. Each acquisition is described separately in the contents list below, titled according to date of acquisition.

Information included in the Description of Papers note and Collection Contents section is drawn from information supplied with the collection and from an initial survey of the contents. Folder titles appearing in the contents list below are often based on those provided by the creator or previous custodian. Titles have not been verified against the contents of the folders in all cases. Otherwise, folder titles are supplied by staff during initial processing.

This finding aid may be updated periodically to account for new acquisitions to the collection and/or revisions in arrangement and description.

Norman Wicklund Macleod (1906-1985)

Norman Wicklund Macleod, poet, author, professor, and editor of *Pembroke Magazine*, was born in Salem, Oregon in 1906. He graduated from the University of New Mexico with a B.A. in 1930, with further studies at the University of Southern California, the University of Oklahoma, and Teachers College of Columbia University, where he received an M.A. in 1936. He began a lifelong career as a poet and editor in the 1920s, contributing to several "little magazines" and later becoming editor of *Briarcliff Quarterly* and founding editor of *Pembroke Magazine*. Among his book-length publications are *Horizons of Death* (New York: Parnassus press, 1934), *Pure as Nowhere* (Columbus, Ohio: Golden Goose, 1952) and *Selected poems of Norman Macleod* (Boise, Idaho: Ahsakta Press, 1975). Macleod taught English and creative writing at several colleges and universities in the United States, as well as the University of Baghdad, Iraq, before becoming Professor of English at Pembroke State University in Pembroke, North Carolina. Macleod died in 1985 in Greenville, North Carolina.
