Biographical / Historical

Richard Benson Sewall served as an English professor at Yale University for more than 40 years. Sewall taught undergraduate courses on English literature, including a course on tragedy in literature. Sewall was also a scholar of Emily Dickinson; his biography of her, *The Life of Emily Dickinson*, was published in 1974 and won the United States National Book Award in Biography. Sewall came from a family of Congregational ministers; his grandfather was the Reverend Augustus Hopkins Strong. Sewall retired from Yale in 1976 and died in 2003.

Scope and Contents

The papers include correspondence and research materials relating to Sewall's scholarship of Emily Dickinson, other areas of poetry and English literature, and the family of Augustus Hopkins Strong, Sewall's maternal grandfather. Also includes correspondence between Sewall and colleagues and former students, and lectures given to various organizations on Emily Dickinson and other topics. Includes course material relating to classes taught by Dr. Sewall at Yale University, including a class on tragedy in literature.

This accession comprises lecture notes and course materials documenting Sewall's tenure as a Yale University professor of English; writings and research files on Emily Dickinson, the Strong family of Rochester, New York, and other areas relating to Sewall's research interests; and correspondence regarding Sewall's research and work at Yale. Also includes personal materials documenting Sewall's professional life and family history.
