Biographical / Historical

Richard W. Cutler was born in New Rochelle, New York, and later moved with his family to Westport, Connecticut. He received both his B.A. (1938) and law degree (1941) from Yale University, after which he went to work for the law firm of Donovan, Leisure, Newton and Lombard in New York City. One of the firm's founding partners, Major General William "Wild Bill" Donovan, was head of the Office of Strategic Services (OSS), the forerunner of the Central Intelligence Agency (CIA). After a brief tenure at the firm, Cutler entered the U.S. Army Air Corps as a second lieutenant in 1943. Shortly thereafter, he was recruited by the OSS, and he served as an intelligence agent in London during the latter half of the Second World War. In the years immediately following the war's conclusion, Cutler was transferred to Berlin, where he continued his work for the OSS.

After his tenure with the OSS, Cutler married Elizabeth Fitzgerald and resumed his legal career, at first returning to New York City, and subsequently settling in his wife's hometown of Milwaukee, Wisconsin, where he launched a successful lifelong career in law, business and government. In 2004, Cutler published, Counterspy: Memoirs of Counterintelligence Officer in World War II and the Cold War. Cutler died on August 17, 2014.

Scope and Contents
