Nanabhai K. Bhatt was an Indian educator and colleague of Mahatma Gandhi. Dr. Pravin Bhatt, his son, is a researcher at the Yale School of Medicine.

Scope and Contents

The materials document the political and social climate in India from the late 1940s through the early 1960s. Correspondence, unless otherwise noted, is from Nanabhai K. Bhatt to his son Pravin N. Bhatt and family. It frequently includes information about general family matters, including celebrations, traditions, travel, and health issues.
