Administrative Information

Immediate Source of Acquisition

The Yale Bookplate Collection was formerly housed in Sterling Memorial Library. The collection was incorporated into the Arts of the Book Collection in 1984 and then moved to the Seeley G. Mudd Library in 1990. In 2011, it was transferred to the Robert B. Haas Family Arts Library.

Scope and Contents

This collection comprises printed illustrations of German coats of arms, individually mounted and labeled, as well as reproductions of early German bookplates and other supporting reference material related to German heraldic devices.

Arrangement

Organized into two series: I. Coats of Arms. II. Reproductions and Reference Works.

Collection Contents

Series I: Coats of Arms

This series contains black-and-white printed illustrations of coats of arms, mounted on individual sheets of paper and labeled with family names. A note included with the materials states that the German crests were used to aid in the identification of bookplates (see Folder 1).

Written on the stationery is a note from W. H. St. John Hope, dated July 6, 1910, and addressed to Rosenheim.	undated
b. 3, f. 36	Reproductions <i>77 items</i> This folder contains photographic reproductions of early (16th and 17th century) German bookplates as well as inscriptions or other related artwork. Some of the black-and-white photographs bear annotations, including blazons or descriptions of the coats of arms, as well as other notes, possible references to numbers from the Franks Collection, etc.	undated
