Biographical / Historical

Mary Susan Osgood was the daughter of George W. and Susan Marston Osgood of Amesbury, Massachusetts. Her father was a ship-carpenter. She married Charles Holman.

Scope and Contents

The Mary S. Osgood Papers consist of letters that she received from friends and relations between 1850 and 1863. Most of the correspondents were young unmarried people (mainly women) who were living and working in various places in Massachusetts (especially Essex County), New Hampshire (especially Manchester), and Maine.

The Mary S. Osgood Papers were forwarded to the Library by George Parmly Day in 1954. They had been left with Yale University Press by George Prescott Tilton along with a transcript of them that he had submitted (unsuccessfully) for publication. The transcript is included in the papers.
