It depicts the social life of a young woman in Hartford, Connecticut, and her visits to New York, Washington, D.C., and Niagara Falls. The last two years of the diary include accounts of her wedding and the birth of her daughter in October, 1858.

Biographical / Historical

Hannah Maria Catlin was born in 1831, in Hartford, Connecticut. She was the only daughter of Julius Catlin, Lieutenant-Governor of Connecticut between 1858 and 1861. She married Benjamin Kinsman Phelps on October 21, 1857. He was a graduate of the Yale College class of 1853, a district attorney of New York County, and a law partner of Chester A. Arthur. They had three children together: Mary Cutler, Dudley, and Anna Kinsman. She died on December 21, 1880.

Scope and Contents

This collection contains a typed transcript of the journal of Hannah Maria (Catlin) Phelps (1831-1880), kept between 1849 and 1859. Hannah Maria Catlin was the daughter of Julius Catlin, Lieutenant-Governor of Connecticut from 1858 to 1861; she married Bejamin Kinsman Phelps (1832-1880, Yale 1853). Her journal describes her life as a well-to-do young lady in Hartford, Connecticut, from the age of seventeen to twenty-one, with special detail being devoted to the summer of 1850, which she spent in Newport, Rhode Island. She made fewer entries in her journal after 1853, and stopped completely after 1855, resuming in October, 1857, only to describe her wedding, and then beginning again in October, 1858, with the birth of her daughter. The journal ends abruptly with December 1859. Throughout, the major topic is social life-callers, suitors, visits to New York, Washington, and Niagara Falls-but Hannah's interest in religion and in self-improvement are also documented, as are the frequent illnesses and deaths of friends and family members.

This journal was the gift to Yale University of Mrs. William H. Merrill, the daughter of Hannah and Benjamin Phelps, whose birth is described in the journal. She presented the typescript to Yale in 1953, and retained possession of the original.
