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## Biographical / Historical

John V. Lindsay: born on November 24, 1921, in New York City; lawyer, former mayor of New York City; B.A., Yale, 1944, LL.B., Yale Law School, 1948; law practice in New York City, 1949- ; executive assistant to the United States Attorney General, 1955-1957; member of the United States House of Representatives, 86th-89th Congress, 17th District, New York, 1959-1965; Mayor of New York City, 1966-1973; vice chairman, National Commission on Civil Disorders, 1967. Died on December 19, 2000, in Hilton Head, South Carolina.

Highly active in civic affairs and conservative political organizations, Constantine Sidamon-Eristoff became Congressman Lindsay's executive assistant in New York in March 1965, continued on as Lindsay's assistant during his subsequent mayoral run and administration, and was appointed by Lindsay as Commissioner of Highways in 1967 and Transportation Administrator in 1968.

Sidamon-Eristoff's papers document Lindsay's 1964 congressional and 1965 mayoral campaigns, as well as affairs of the Transportation Administration spanning 1967-1973. The bulk of the materials focus on Lindsay's 1965 mayoral run, including extensive documentation of campaign finances, internal memos and training materials for campaign workers, campaign operations and contact lists organized by election and assembly district, and campaign literature, press releases and position papers. Also included are Sidamon-Eristoff's notes, speeches, reports, correspondence, and personal and professional files from his years with the Lindsay administration.
