SUMMARY: The collection consists of correspondence, writings, and drawings by or related to William Makepeace Thackeray. Correspondence includes letters written by Thackeray to colleagues such as Connop Thirlwall and William Webb Follett Synge, and letters to Thackeray from potential contributors to Cornhill Magazine. Writings include an autograph manuscript of a chapter of *The Adventures of Philip*, an autograph poem parodying Goethe's *Werther*, and an autograph manuscript notebook with memoranda, drawings, and quotations from American history, used by Thackeray while writing *The Virginians*. Also present are sixteen sketches in watercolor and graphite by Thackeray, two groups of ink illustrations for Thackeray's writings by John Priestman Atkinson, and a portrait of Thackeray by an unidentified artist.

Scope and Contents

The collection consists of correspondence, writings, and drawings by or related to William Makepeace Thackeray. Correspondence includes letters written by Thackeray to colleagues such as Connop Thirlwall and William Webb Follett Synge, and letters to Thackeray from potential contributors to *The Cornhill Magazine*. Writings include an autograph manuscript of a chapter of *The Adventures of Philip*, and an autograph manuscript notebook with memoranda, drawings, and quotations from American history, used by Thackeray while writing *The Virginians*. Also present are sixteen sketches in watercolor and graphite by Thackeray, two groups of ink illustrations for Thackeray's writings by John Priestman Atkinson, and a portrait of Thackeray by an unidentified artist.
