Robert B. Fisher (1919-2004)

In 1950, Robert Burns Fisher moved to Washington Township, California, and established a medical practice in San Jose. Fisher was keenly interested in local history, especially pioneer families who settled the area. He researched and sought the preservation of historic resources in Southern Alameda County. In 1962, he founded Mission Peak Heritage Foundation in Fremont, California. Fisher was an expert on European photography and a collector photographs, as well as a contributor of articles on the history of photography to the *Journal of the West* and *Daguerreian Annual*.

Scope and Contents

This collection chiefly consists of photographs collected by Robert B. Fisher, but also includes his subject files and a small quantity of writings related to the history of photography, 1840-1998.

Photographs in the collection include cased photographs, stereographs, glass transparencies, and lantern slides. The collection includes a particularly rich variety of stereograph formats, including daguerreotype stereographs, ambrotype stereographs, tintype stereographs, glass stereographs, salted paper print stereographs, tissue stereographs, and card stereographs. The collection also provides visual documentation of the Niagara Falls region and the Great Britain during the middle of the nineteenth century. Photographers and stereograph publishers with significant quantities of photographic material in the collection include Edward Anthony, Platt Delascus Babbitt, Bierstadt Brothers, Keystone View Company, Langenheim Brothers, London Stereoscopic Company, New York Stereoscopic Company, and Underwood & Underwood.

Printed material in the collection includes illustrated articles, tear sheets, and prints with illustrations primarily published during the nineteenth century that Fisher compiled principally as resources for identifying photographic images.

Papers in the collection relate mainly to Fisher's photographic collection and the history of photography, as well as drafts of his articles in the *Journal of the West* and *Daguerreian Annual*.

Collection Contents

Series I: Cased Photographs, 1840-circa 1860

5.2 linear feet (6 boxes)

This series consists of cased photographs, which are usually daguerreotypes, ambrotypes, or tintypes mounted in sturdy, boxlike cases. It includes thirty-nine daguerreotypes, two ambrotypes, and one tintype, as well as seven examples of empty cases.

Series I is organized into four subseries: Daguerreotypes, Ambrotypes, Tintype, and Cases.

The contents of each subseries are arranged alphabetically under headings for identified creators, followed by items with unidentified creators

Anthony, Clark Co.

Edward Anthony (1819-1888) and James R. Clark (died 1848), also known as Isaiah or Isaac Clark, were partners in the firm Anthony, Clark & Co. at 247 Broadway, New York City, 1846-1847

Series II: Stereographs, 1850-1975

4.2 linear feet (5 boxes)

This series consists of stereoscopic photographs in different formats, including daguerreotypes, ambrotypes, tintypes, glass, salted paper print, and tissue stereographs, as well as general stereograph cards that possess albumen and silver gelatin photographic prints.

Stereographs are double photographic prints that depict the same image taken from two slightly different perspectives and mounted on cards. Viewing the two-dimensional images through a stereoscope creates the illusion of a three-dimensional image to the viewer.

Entries for stereographs in each subseries include their titles, numbers on the mounts, and their series. The entries also document if no numbers or series information exists.

Entries may occasionally include descriptions of the images to clarify the subjects of the stereographs.

Series II is organized into seven subseries: Daguerreotype Stereographs, Ambrotypes Stereographs, Tintype Stereographs, Glass Stereographs, Salted Paper Print Stereographs, Stereographs, Tissue Stereographs, and Card Stereographs.

Headings in each subseries are arranged alphabetically by identified creators followed by items with unidentified creators. Items under each name are arranged either chronologically, alphabetically by title, or sequentially by stereograph number.

This series consists of glass transparencies and lantern slides, which are formats designed for viewing by transmitted light. The material chiefly consists of transparent positive photographs, as well as some transparent non-photographic images that are designed for projection viewing or as intermediates for reproduction.

Individual titles and dates of lantern slides were not captured during processing the collection.
