Processing Information

This collection received a basic level of processing. Various acquisitions associated with the collection have not been merged and organized as a whole. Each acquisition is described separately in the contents list below, identified by month and year of acquisition.

The finding aid for this collection is compiled from individual preliminary lists for each acquisition that were created at the time of receipt by the library; however, the content of the lists was neither modified nor verified. As a rule, descriptive information found in the Collection Contents section is drawn in large part from information supplied with the collection and from an initial survey of the contents. Folder titles appearing in the contents list below are often based on those provided by the creator or previous custodian. Titles have not been verified against the contents of the folders in all cases. Otherwise, folder titles are supplied by staff during initial processing.

Harry Holtzman (1912-1987)

Harry Holtzman was born in New York, and studied at the Art Students League under Hans Hoffman. In the early 1930s Holtzman traveled to Paris where he met the Dutch painter Piet Mondrian (1872-1944), and in 1940 sponsored Mondrian's immigration to the United States. From 1950 to 1975 Holtzman taught at Brooklyn College. He was the author and editor of several books on Mondrian and was executor of the painter's estate.

Scope and Contents

The Harry Holtzman Papers contain correspondence, writings, photographs and negatives, slides, notes, personal papers, and motion picture films that document the life and career of author and educator Harry Holtzman, principally his work with and writings on the painter Piet Mondrian.

Arrangement

Organized into three groupings by date of accession: I. January 1999 Acquisition. II. March 1999 Acquisition, 1945-1987. III. June 1999 Acquisition.
