The series consists of a group of papers documenting the financial and business relationship of William Blake and John Linnell. The items are fully described in "New Blake Documents" by Geoffrey Keynes (*Times Literary Supplement*, January 9, 1943) and in *Blake Studies: Notes on His Life and Work, in Seventeen Chapters*, by Geoffrey Keynes (London, R. Hart-Davis, 1949).
