Processing Information

Currier & Ives

Nathaniel Currier and James Merritt Ives, publishers of popular prints in New York between 1857 and 1907. After the firm disbanded, other publishers, including Joseph Koehler in New York and S. Lipschitz in London, acquired the company's lithographic stones and reprinted the images.

Scope and Contents

A collection of caricatures of African Americans published by the firm Currier & Ives as a series of "Darktown" comics. The drawings were made by artists associated with the firm, primarily John Cameron (1828-1906) and Thomas Worth (1834-1917). Also present are restrikes of "Darktown" images published later by Joseph Koehler in New York and S. Lipschitz & Son in London.

At the folder level, references are provided to the two standard Currier & Ives catalogues: *Currier & Ives: a Catalogue Raisonné* (Detroit: Gale Research, 1983) and *Currier & Ives Prints: an Illustrated Checklist*, by Frederick A. Conningham (New York: Crown Publishers, 1983).

Arrangement

Organized into two series: I. Published by Currier & Ives, 1880-1896. II. Restrikes, 1907.

Collection Contents

Series I: Published by Currier & Ives , 1880-1896

Series I contains lithographs issued by the Currier & Ives firm.

The collection combines two groups of prints donated to the library separately by Carl Van Vechten and Julia Millhiser Gimbel, resulting in several instances of duplicate prints in the folders; these are noted at the folder level. Because the prints were hand colored, there are usually differences in coloring, and even variant title fonts in some cases. The donor's name is generally noted on the verso of each print, with Van Vechten's gifts bearing bookplates.

Arranged in alphabetical order by title. However, companion or sequel prints were paired and foldered together, thus disrupting a strict alphabetical sequence.

Series II contains eight prints issued by two firms that had acquired Currier & Ives lithographic stones after the company had closed operations. Joseph Koehler in New York published a numbered "Currier & Ives" series, while Lipschitz in London did not credit Currier & Ives.
