SUMMARY: Letters and diaries document Long's YMCA work in Tianjin (Tientsin) and Shenyang (Mukden) and shed light on the political situation in China during the 1920s. Austin O. Long was a YMCA worker in Tianjin (Tientsin), China from 1919 to 1923 and in Shenyang (Mukden), Manchuria from 1924 to 1928.

1888	○ Born in Buffalo, New York
1908	○ Graduated from Hiram College, OH
19xx	○ Ordained minister, Church of Christ, Buffalo, NY
1918	○ Went to China, attended North China Union Language School, Beijing (Peking)
1919-1923	○ Served YMCA in Tianjin (Tientsin); family vacationed in Beidaihe (Peitaho) during summers
1924 January- November	○ Furlough
1924 November-1928	○ Served YMCA in Shenyang (Mukden), Manchuria
1928	○ Returned to U.S. for education of children; served YMCAs in Brooklyn and Flushing NY, Scranton, PA. Worked for United China Relief during early part of World War II; opened and operated U.S.O. in Pensacola, FL during 1940s.
1967	○ Died

Scope and Contents

Regular and detailed letters from Austin O. Long to his family members in the United States provide valuable documentation of YMCA work in Tianjin (Tientsin) and Shenyang (Mukden). Letters are weekly for the first several years but decline in frequency to biweekly or monthly towards the end of his term. Long describes his daily activities in detail; he comments on the political situation, on relations with Chinese YMCA staff, on Masonic activities in his community, etc. An interesting letter of January 23, 1927 discusses the disruption of denominational cooperation in North China caused by Canadian missionary Goforth. The diaries or appointment books provide extremely detailed documentation of Long's daily schedule. They are factual rather than introspective in nature.

Many of the letters are carbon copies typed on both sides of thin paper. They are legible but cannot be easily photocopied or scanned.
